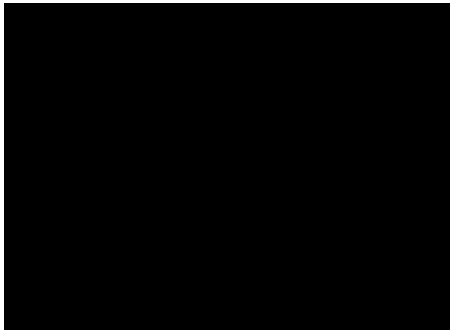

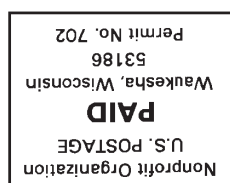
Eric Weier (02-04) lives in Eagle. He's attending UW-Whitewater majoring in special education and works as an instructional assistant for Mukwonago High School.
